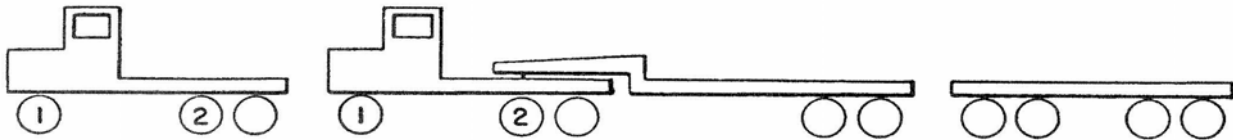

GENERAL CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

1. Applications must be complete and submitted on forms approved by the Board.
2. Permits will be issued for vehicles owned by the applicant or operated under a bona fide lease agreement.
3. Move to be made with a minimum of interference to traffic, and at no time will the highway be closed to other traffic.
4. If, on account of the move of said vehicle or load, any highway sign, structure or railing is required to be and is moved, the same will be replaced by the applicant, to the satisfaction of the Board.
5. The Vehicle will not be loaded or unloaded within the outer shoulder limits of any county highway or roadway.
6. The operator in charge of moving the equipment must have the permit in his possession during the progress of the movement. Permit must be shown upon demand, to any police officer or employee of the Board.
7. Highways traveled must be followed in sequence as listed on permit.
8. The permit, if issued, in no way supersedes posted or restricted axle loading limits.
9. Oversize permits are not valid during spring weight restrictions.
10. Applicant will be responsible for damages to the highway, to persons or to property, caused by or arising out of the movement involved, and will indemnify and save the County harmless from suits, claims, and damage of every kind or nature arising from use of the highways involved herein. Applicant shall immediately report to the Board any damage caused to or along the highway.
11. Misrepresentation of information set forth in the application for the permit or noncompliance with the provisions on which the permit is issued, shall immediately void the permit and subject the parties involved to appropriate legal action.
12. No permits will be issued for Saturday after 12:00 noon, Sunday, holidays, or for any period of darkness – nighttime hours.
13. In the event vehicles or loads cannot be moved on the date specified on the permit, an extension may be granted, if application is made to the permit office. A new application and permit will be required if the load is not moved within 10 days from the date shown on the permit.
14. Loads shall be arranged to effect the minimum width, height and length.
15. A permit is VOID whenever road, weather or traffic conditions make travel unsafe.
16. Permits are valid only for a single trip if item is over 14 feet wide.
17. Insurance coverage's must be in force and effect on each vehicle while operating on the public highways under this permit, and current certificates of insurance must be furnished with following limits:

18. On specific movements, the Board may require more insurance coverage than set forth in Paragraph No. 16.
19. If the equipment is to be moved on any roadway not under the jurisdiction of the Board, permission must be obtained from the appropriate authorities.
20. All weights and dimensions listed in the application for permit are to be the actual weights and dimensions of the described loaded vehicle(s).
21. The boom on cranes or draglines is to be securely fastened to the frame of the truck and parallel to the highway while in transit. The ball or bucket is to be removed from the boom.
NOTE: Permits will not be issued for oversize or overweight vehicles or loads which can be normally dismantled, reduced or otherwise rearranged to come within the legal limits.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PERMITS TO MOVE BUILDINGS

22. Accompanying the application for permit, a surety bond in the sum of \$5,000.00 indemnifying the Board against loss or damage arising from the performance of acts set forth in paragraph 4 is required for each individual movement of any building exceeding 14 feet in width.
23. The building to be moved must be loaded in a workmanlike and safe manner, and all brick and any other loose material must be removed from the building prior to movement on the highway.
24. The mover must make prior arrangements with the proper authorities for the handling of wires, cables, signs and signals, the crossing of railroads, and for necessary trimming and protection of trees.
25. In the event of a breakdown or unavoidable delay, every effort must be made to remove the building from the highway. If the building cannot be removed, it shall be clearly marked with warning lights, and be attended by watchmen to direct traffic and insure public safety.
26. An auxiliary power unit capable of properly towing the load, is to accompany the movement. A building may be moved between the side rails of bridges if the horizontal clearance between such rails exceeds the width of the building by at least 12 inches. If the width of the building is greater than the horizontal clearance of any bridge, the building must be loaded on the moving equipment in such manner that the underside of supporting cross timbers will clear the rails by at least 12 inches at all times.
